MISSION UPDATE

The following is from Ed and Mary Fox, CTEN, Guatemala.

This note will let you know we still are alive and kicking, as we have not updated you for perhaps three months. Mary has experienced an extremely difficult year physically, first with her eye complications and then with a severe case of shingles that has lasted over four months. We celebrated (figuratively) 10 years since her last chemo treatment, however, just this month. Which reminds me, I am overdue with flushing her chemo port. It's not fun, but we kept the port originally because her type of lymphoma never goes into complete remission and because her doctor thought he detected a new growth that first year. Nothing has grown or been detected since, however, praise the Lord!

Ten years is a great start, and we're so grateful to God for preserving Mary's life and ability to continue on in this world and even in ministry. Mary herself says that the last ten years constitute one of the most productive and spiritually-rewarding periods of her entire life. I can attest to the fact!

Mary has not been able to wear clothes normally, either, due to the long-lasting effects of the shingles. She has large areas of scarring on the center and left sides of her torso, where the shingles have caused serious nerve damage and pain. Mary has been unable to sleep on her left side the past four months. She has only started being able to go out again this month, with a few exceptions. For those of you who know how active my wife is, that fact alone is difficult to believe.

Leaning on Jesus was the title of our devotional Friday night, based on John 13:23, 25 (in Our Daily Bread) before Ed left on his trip for San Andrés. There was rain Friday night, and the road was as treacherous as ever as they keep trying to pave it little by little, but creating dangerous mud sloughs and dirt drifts before, behind and on every side. Ed survived, thank the Lord, skillfully maneuvering the trusty standard transmission 4WD pickup thru.

The drive takes such a toll on his back and heart that he should rest up for a few days after getting there, but he has the many house matters to deal with himself, as well as instructing coworkers and leaving them money to take care of things that can't be left till "next time," so keep praying that he will get some rest and healing and be able to "lean on Jesus."

Chepe and his mother, Ke'l, cleaned up the yard, office and workroom yesterday, and today (12/12) Chepe was to have cleaned the house. Neighbors and friends have been helpful.

Please pray for the rest of the details to fall into place for the rest of the time out there and for Ed to have wisdom in what he does and in the arrangements he makes with coworkers and that he will not be in too much pain to meet his goals.

Please pray that I will have wisdom and discipline in attention to the remaining details of the Pauline epistles. I am very thankful to God that I have been able to get to church the last couple of Sundays, just in time to get involved in the Lenten and Easter choirs, and that God has supplied my need for appropriate and not too painful clothing and that the seatbelt is not as painful anymore. I am thankful to God that I can see so well.
