## MISSION UPDATE

The following is from **Gil Zinke**, Training Leaders International.

All 11 members of our team converged safely in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on Friday morning. Nine came from Minneapolis via Toronto. Another came via Kenya. I came from Chicago through London. Pastor Tesfaye had been unavoidably delayed leaving Hawassa, but he had sent a driver from Bishoftu to meet us. That driver had brought along the shuttle bus from our hotel to handle all the luggage.

The nine members of the team who came through Toronto had their luggage mistakenly tagged to go on to Hawassa. They stopped it from getting actually loaded onto the next plane, but the luggage already had been transferred to the Domestic Terminal. Therefore, we had to go there to pick it up. Then we went straight to our hotel and settled into our rooms.

We spent the rest of the morning at the Ethnologic Museum of the University of Addis Ababa learning about tribal and national customs. Our guide explained tribal and royal artifacts and Ethiopian Orthodox icons. Then we lunched back at the hotel.

When Pastor Tesfaye still had not arrived by 2 p.m., we went to see Sister Alemnesh's brother, Pastor Fikadu Endale, Executive Director of an orphanage, the Alem Children Support Organization. Besides the orphanage, the compound also houses a sewing shop to employ poor women, fields and farming equipment and the current headquarters of the Ethiopian Addis Kidan (New Covenant) Baptist Church denomination. It is an association with 120 congregations and 50 church plants in progress. The General Secretary of the association showed us a PowerPoint Presentation of the various, vibrant activities of their churches. We also heard some stirring testimonies of the rescuing grace of God. After that, we fed fresh fruit to the kids and spent time loving on them. (To be continued.)
