Pray for all Who Profess to be Christians

O my Strength, I will sing praise to You, for You, my loving God, are my strength, my fortress, my joy, my reward. I rejoice again in Your unlimited power and Your many promises to answer prayer. My heart trusts You, and I am helped and deeply blessed.

Lord, how Your heart is grieved by the many people who seem to be Christians in name only—by the more than 1 billion nominal Christians in the world today. Have mercy on them—including ones I know personally. Whether they are lukewarm believers or don't know You at all, convince them of their sins and spiritual sickness, their empty ritualism, their compromise, their ignorance and indifference, their loving what gives them pleasure rather than loving You. Make them aware of Your deep longing to make them truly—and wholly—Yours. Deliver them from merely acting as if they know You. Bring them into true faith and full commitment to Christ. Lead them into a warm, vital relationship with You. May Your Spirit work in their lives—and mine—with mighty power, making us a glory to Your name.
