### **PRAYER PROMPTS**

- Have you allowed your limitations to keep you from the destiny God has for you? Then place yourself in the hands of the mighty God, for it is he who does great things.
- Reflect on this week's worship service, the music, Scriptures, and Pastor Dave's Advent meditation, "Overshadowed"\* (Luke 1:30-35). Pray that the Lord will lead you to ways to apply the lessons learned in your own walk with Christ and as you connect with different people this week.
