When Help Comes Unexpectedly

The current series of Touch Points is taken from “Time Out in Tough Times,” from the editors of Guide-posts (MIF Books, 2009). The reflections come from a variety of writers.

This week’s topic relates to the theme of “Goodness” used in the first LIF@E Time session today looking at gospel messages in the film “It’s a Wonderful Life.” It also is a reminder this week of Thanksgiving to be a blessing to others.

READ: He who does good is of God. . . 3 John 11

REFLECT: One freezing night during basic training, my buddy and I tried in vain to hammer our wooden tent pegs into the crusty ground. We struggled on, thinking of the cold night ahead, managing only to break another wooden peg.

Then someone said over my shoulder, “You guys look like you could use a little help.”

He was tall, dressed in the same army-issue clothing. He had a small sledgehammer and six brand-new metal tent pegs. It took him no more than a minute to set up our tent, then he moved on.

“I was praying for help,” Jack muttered, “but I never expected an angel.”

I believe the tent-peg man *was* an angel. We never saw him again, and no one could account for his presence than night.

Years later, I did someone an anonymous favor—small, but significant to the person it helped. So, stay alert. You might have been helped by an angel. Any might be called upon to be one.
